Aditya is the third child in his family and has four siblings. Unfortunately, his father passed away when he was 8-years-old. His mother, Rosmita has a small business selling satay at a small stall located in front of their house. Rosmita does everything she can to ensure that all her children are able to receive quality education and are well-educated, as well as eating nutritious food.

However, being the sole breadwinner and guardian of the family is not easy. The living conditions of the family are not ideal. Rosmita works daily from 8am till 10pm without taking a day off and as a result, she is overwhelmed. Aditya's two older siblings decided to stop school to help the family.

Thankfully, Aditya has been benefiting from this project since July 2021. The Orphan Sponsorship allows Aditya to study in the mahad without having to pay for any fees, and giving him access to quality education, a place to stay, nutritious food and security. He is currently studying in Mahad Ibnu Sina, Grade VII.

Gaza Annual Food Program

Right now, 736 million people are trapped in a vicious poverty cycle, lying in extreme poverty and surviving on less than \$1.90 a day. More than half of that staggering number - 385 million - are children.

On their own, these poverty-stricken communities do not have a way out of poverty because more often than not, this is the life they were born into. Moreover as a result of COVID-19, many countries will see a general increase in their poverty rates.

When it comes to winter, not everyone can afford or are able to get access to nutritious food. In fact, many living in impoverished regions are surviving with barely enough food to get by. There are far too many families at the mercy of the below-freezing weather this season while thousands are also forced to choose between heating their homes, or having proper meals.

Together, we have provided food to over 1300 beneficiaries. While we are blessed with the choices of food that we can get here, we want to continuously ensure that our brothers and sisters in underprivileged countries are able to get the same nutritious meals and food.

Grandma Maiyom lives with her daughter and three young grandchildren. She takes care of her grandchildren while their mother goes to work. Besides taking care of them, Grandma Maiyom does the household chores and is responsible for finding water for the family to use for daily essentials.

She spent hours of her days collecting water from a local well. When the dry season hits her region, it affects how much water the well has. However, with their own access to safe, clean water at the comfort of their home, Grandma Maiyom and family have more time for more important things.

“We have to have water to live. Now I don’t have to struggle with collecting water daily or affect my grandchildren’s time that they can now use to focus on their education. My grandchildren can go to school and I can focus on the things that matter most like cooking, cleaning.”

This is all possible thanks to the generous contributions of our GER community. Water gives our caretakers and guardians the health they need to care for their loved ones. Water gives them more hope for a brighter future. Together we can give individuals like Grandma Maiyom a more comfortable life, more time and more hope for their families.

GLOBAL WAKAF PROJECT

Qur'an

“Wherever they are, they deserve to learn the Qu’ran”

Each month, Global Ehsan Relief distributes Wakaf Al-Quran to various different communities who need it in Indonesia. While the majority of the population is Muslim, many rural areas of poor communities are lacking in Qur'an. Despite being neglected in rural areas, we believe that they should have access to Quranic education. Through our Wakaf Quran project, our beneficiaries receive their own mushaf for recitation and learning.

For instance in December 2021, a big part of the Wakaf Quran distributions were carried out in regions such as Padang, Pekanbaru, Kediri, Cirebon and Aceh. The individuals living in vulnerable communities received brand new copies of the Qur'an so that the jemaah can peruse, learn, and recite from it. Alhamdulillah, students and adults alike were excited to receive the materials needed to learn the Qur'an and to be closer to the religion.

Through our Palestine Emergency Appeal, we encourage our community to help rebuild the homes of our Palestinian brothers and sisters and provide them with essentials for them to rebuild their lives.

GLOBAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE

In December 2021, the Southeast Asia region was rocked by devastating natural disasters that happened all within the same week. In Indonesia, the ash from the Mount Semeru eruption blanketed several neighbouring cities - destroying homes and contaminating water sources, including rivers. More than 5,200 homes and buildings were damaged and the lives of 48 people were lost.

The impact from the flood in Malaysia is just as devastating and heartbreaking. While floods in Malaysia are one of the most common natural disasters to hit the country - especially during the monsoon season - the flood that started on 17 December 2021 is said to be the worst experienced by the country in 30 years and one of the deadliest flooding in Malaysia's history. More than 54,000 individuals were affected by the floods that swept across seven states, and the figures continued increasing weeks after the first wave of floods happened.

Rebuilding their lives after such a devastating disaster is certainly not easy, and it is certainly not something that the community can do on their own. Part of GER's work is responding to crises and emergencies around the globe by providing immediate assistance to help victims cope with the aftermath of the disaster. In both countries, our GER Malaysian and Indonesian team rendered urgent aid to the victims of both natural disasters.

FLOOD RELIEF OUR IMPACT



In all my years of living here, this is the first time I'm experiencing a flood like this. On 20th December, the water started increasing and coming into the house. At that time, it was 3am and my husband wasn't at home, he was at the hospital. So I quickly left home with three of my children, the youngest being only four months old. I was then transferred to the Temporary Relief Centre (PPS) Mentakab Jaya, 10 minutes away from my house.

Honestly, a flood like this did not even cross my mind. I could not take the risk, so I knew I had to quickly bring my family out to safety. When we came home, we all saw the effects of the flood.

The water reached halfway up the walls of the house and all our belongings were affected. Because when we left in the early morning, I couldn't bring everything with me. The most important was saving the lives of my children, that was it.

I'm sad, but I accept our fate. I would also like to convey my gratitude to all the external organisations, friends and neighbours who have been helping us to rebuild our lives.

WINTER EMERGENCY APPEAL

In this quarter, our own team was able to be involved in the first round of distributions in three countries - Jordan, Lebanon and Turkey. Together with our international partners, we lend a helping hand to Syrian and Palestinian refugees living in dire conditions. Our intentions and goals are to provide aid to as many refugees during one of the most difficult conditions of the year - the unrelenting, harsh winter season.

In Jordan, our team visited GER's School for Syrian Refugees, located in the Sadba Area in Al-Mafraq. The students received winter clothes, jackets, socks, boots, toys and snacks. The team also visited a number of refugee camps in different parts of Jordan where items such as food aid packages, coals and blankets were distributed with the help of our partner, Islamic Help Jordan.

We travelled to Bekaa Valley, Lebanon for the next leg of the trip. Winter was approaching and the locals shared how the winter season could be unrelenting in the Bekaa Valley region, where heavy snow frequently occurs. The Winter Emergency Appeal distributions ended in Turkey, where our team travelled to three different cities for the distributions. Additionally, our Malaysian team travelled into Idlib, Syria where they visited a few refugee camps and the Girls Orphan Education Centre in Maahad Noor, a centre sponsored by our GER community.

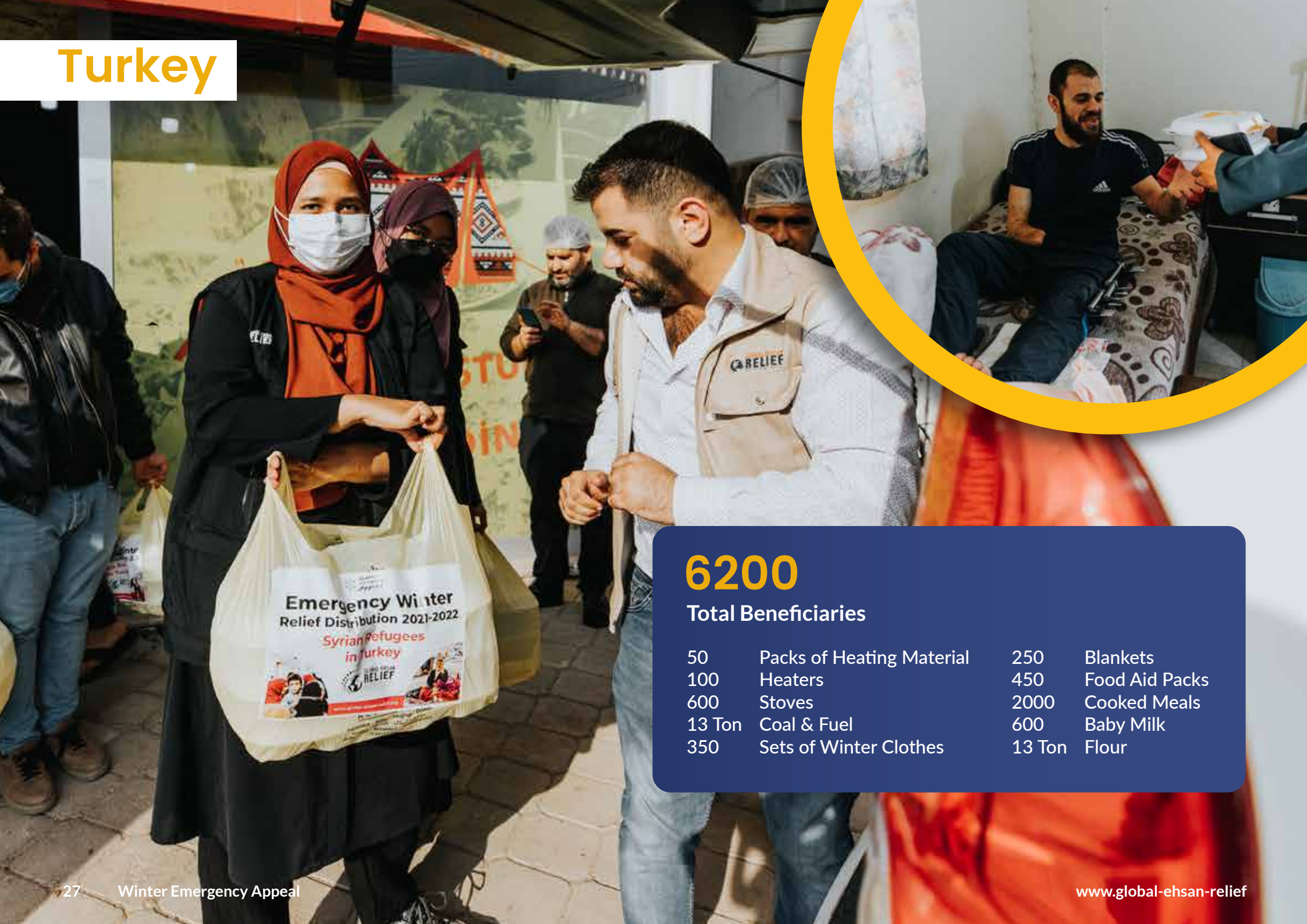

WINTER EMERGENCY OUR IMPACT



When our team met Muhammad Haj Zubaida in Gaziantep, Turkey he was not in the best of health. He had an operation on his back years ago after an accident in Syria. He has seven children but some are married and only two are currently living with him and his wife in the house. They have been in Turkey since 2013.

Due to his health condition, he is unable to work, hence his wife is the sole breadwinner in the family. She works in the Gaziantep city area at a factory that makes shoes and her salary is typical of a daily worker - her salary is 1,400 lira monthly which is about \$140.

The family pays 600 lira for rent every month and that is almost half of the wife's salary. Some days the family do not have money to even buy bread. Alhamdulillah they are also receiving help from Onsur, one of our international partners. The food aid will In shaa Allah support them for 20 days.

We believe that every child deserves a happy and healthy childhood, no matter their circumstances.

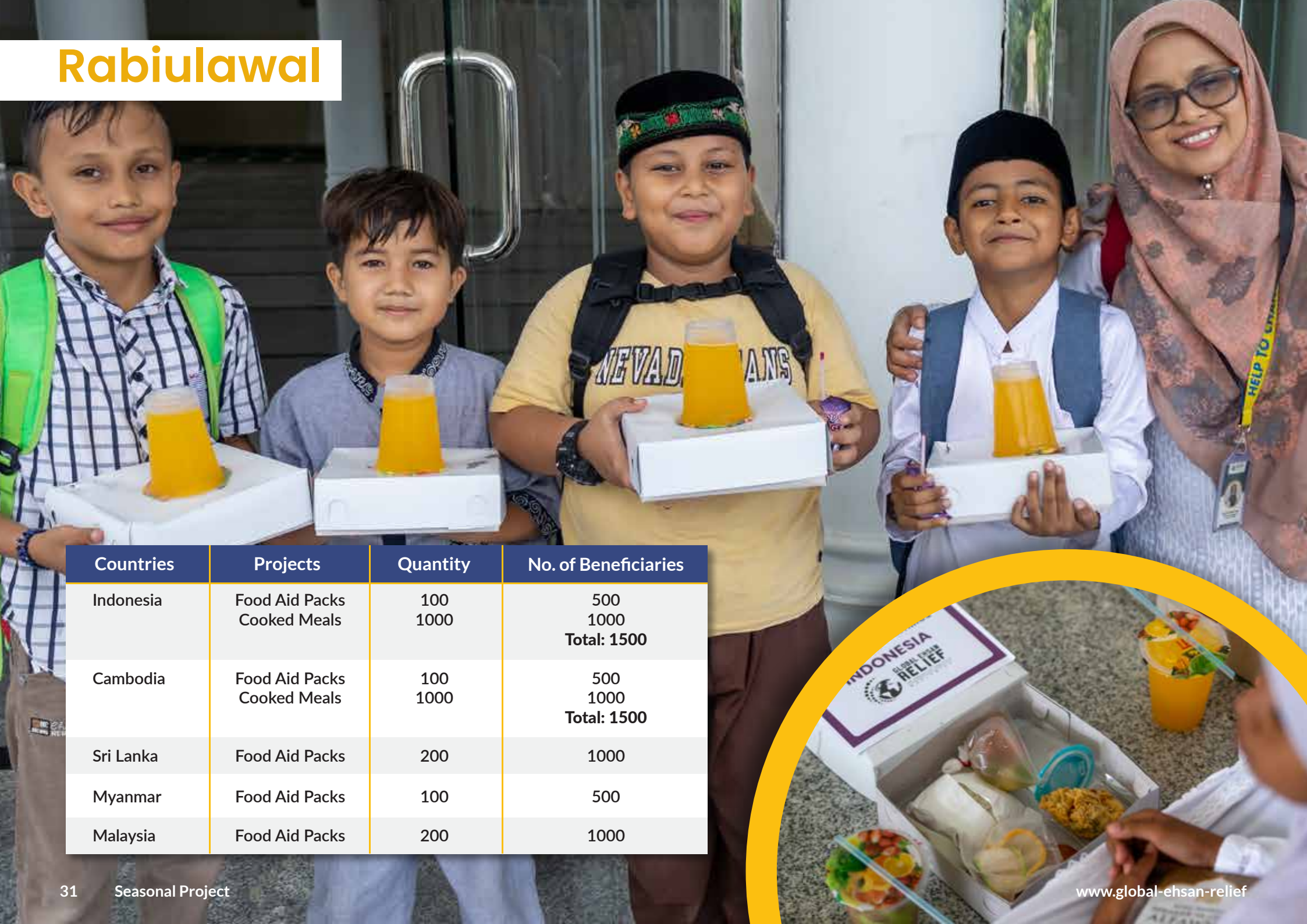

For Eka Kirana (not her real name), a tiny, wooden home is the reality for her and her two beautiful young daughters. As the sole breadwinner of the family, Eka works as a daily worker, doing a wide array of work, anything she can find. For the sake of her children, she does anything she can to earn money. She values education for her children and she understood the importance of being able to send her daughters to school.

Unfortunately, the family is left without a father figure. Before his passing, Eka's husband left the family with nothing but a small, wooden house. The living conditions of the family are not ideal. Living in a tiny, wooden house, they have no valuable assets. While they are blessed with a shelter to live under, the small wooden house does not guarantee their home is in a good condition, or that it provides them sufficiently with things they need to thrive.

Our Home for Widows project is committed to provide better living conditions for the two most vulnerable groups of individuals - widows and orphans. We believe that widows can lead a rewarding life after going through stages of grief and growth. Together, we can help to lessen the challenging plight of widows and ease their journey in nurturing their children and providing a better future for their families.

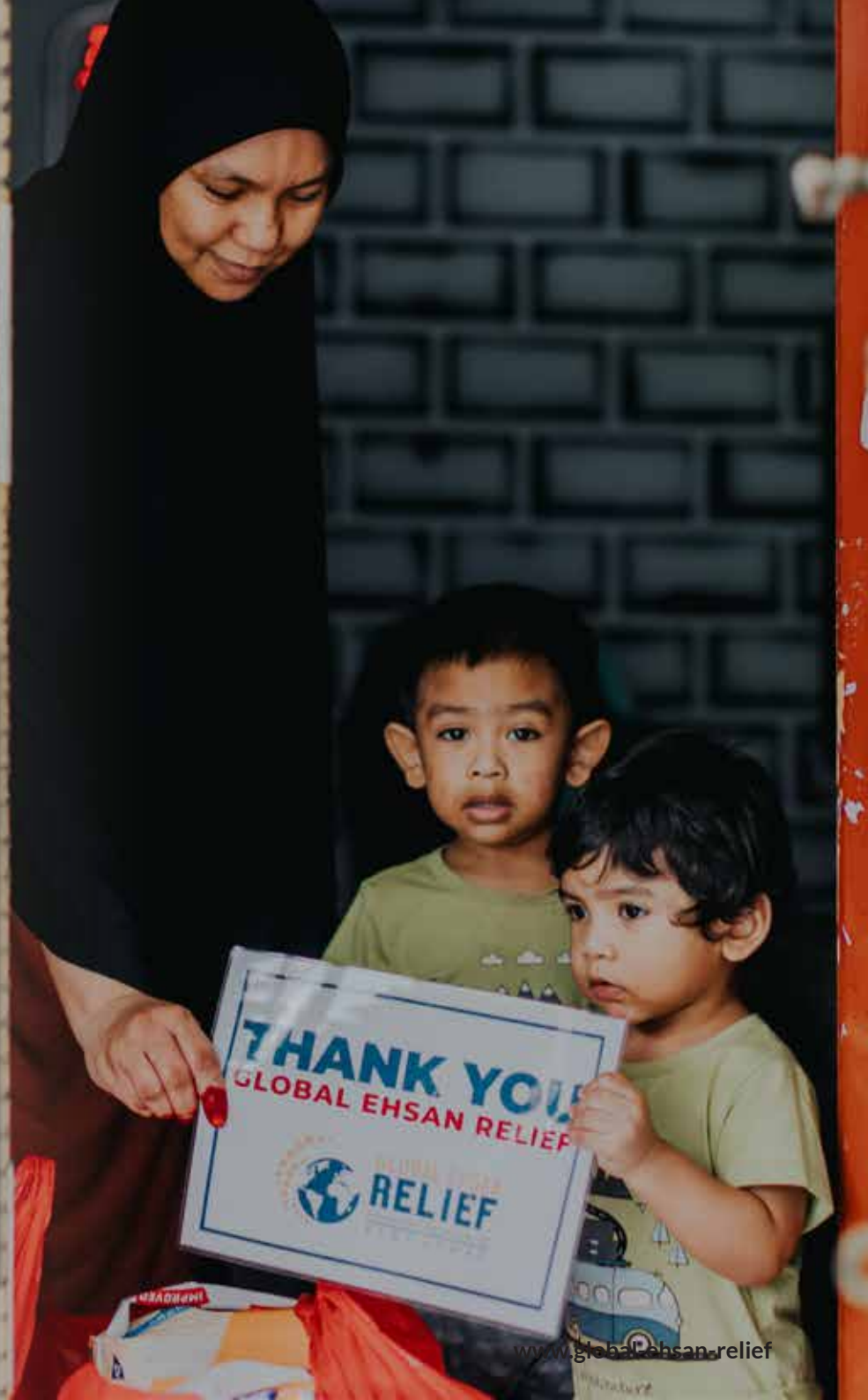
Back To School Charity Ride

For instance on November 19, 200 bottles of soya milk were distributed during Friday prayers at Masjid Nurun Naim in Khor Village, Phnom Penh.
